Classifications Introduction

As endorsed by ArcheryGB, there is nine different classifications levels available to all archers. The purpose is to give you an opportunity to manage your own progress and earn badges as rewards for your continued progression.

Badges are obtained from the Records Officer based on you recording your scores and sending via the club website.

The club can only provide the first six classifications. Archery and bowmen tiers. Please see administered by column in the next table.

You can either shoot one round that meets the minimum requirements of arrows; or shoot multiple rounds reaching the desired score, per event, over multiple events to obtain your award.

Classifications Table (Example 1)

To obtain Archer 3rd (A3) class (12 dozen arrows required):
 Recurve 50+ Male archer shoots Bristol IV and scores 805.

Where the round is:

- 6 dozen arrows at 40 yards,
- 4 dozen arrows at 30 yards &
- 2 dozen arrows at 20 yards.

 Where each round is 6 dozen arrows.
 3 dozen at 40 metres &
 3 dozen at 30 metres

Key Requirements to Obtain an Award

For the Records Officer to provide an award, the following is required:

- Score sheets are sent using the following link - <https://www.acdelcobowmenarchery.club/results-and-records>
- Each score sheet must be completed in full and counter-signed. If data is missing, such as bow type, date, your record will not count
- If you wish to obtain award, please confirm via email to records@acdelcobowmenarchery.club and provide details of the date(s), round(s) and award
- Payment of £3 per badge is required to the AC Delco Bowmen club bank account
- The Records Officer will choose to accept the original paper copy score sheets, depending on the event and prior agreement from those archers taking part

Records provided are stored in a database against the archers' name and includes all score sheet information and classification obtained. After payment, badges for archery tiers are provided usually within 14 days.
